

2.2	KZN & NW Constitutions (Amy & Vicky)	 Feedback KZNMA Constitution: (Amy) KZN council meeting next week to finalise constitution, they will send to national council next week. Feedback NW Constitution: (Diane on behalf of Vicky) Constitution sent wasn't applicable to mounted archery (used a western mounted games constitution). President communicated this to them, they apologised and sent the correct constitution (they accidentally sent the wrong constitution to Diane), the one they did send is sufficient; it is based on the GMAA constitution. Few small errors in the constitution, they will correct it and vote in at their next AGM. 	Diane: To send KZN constitution to council to review.

3.	SAEF AGM Feedback (Diane)		
3.1	Indigenous Riding	Indigenous Riding has petered out – no further action from them in becoming an associate member of SAEF.	
3.2	AHS Vaccinations	AHS – still experiencing shortages of vaccines due to business failure at Onderstepoort. Ian Sanne is part of the discussion panel currently trying to allow private suppliers of vaccines to be approved. The exemption from AHS vaccines expired end October 2022, and the Veterinary Committee is discussing whether to extend this exemption for the next competitive season as well.	Diane: Send mail to Sharlene asking when we'll know about AHS requirements for 2023 competitions, we need to communicate to our members.

3.3	Flu Vaccines	Flu vaccines – it was pointed out that the last equine flu outbreak was in 2001. Some disciplines are not enforcing the 2 x per year rule for flu vaccines, and are only immunizing once a year. It was suggested that the rule be changed to only once a year for flu vaccines, the suggestion will be put to the Veterinary committee to discuss and make a decision.	
3.4	SAEF Membership Fees	SAEF membership fees are increasing by 15% for 2023. They have not increased fees for the past two years. Senior members will now pay R750 per year, Juniors R460 per year. Entry level riders are still free.	
4.	SAEF Response to National	Feam Selection (Diane)	
4.1	Feedback	Diane spoke to Sharlene, it appears that we are only supposed to select a National team if we are going to have an official test match, not every year as we are doing now. Also, the one rider from the 2021 team selection would not qualify to ride with the next team, as the selection is only valid for one year.

5.1	Feedback	Letter sent to Alan le Gall on 13 th October. Alan asked Diane to address the letter to President of Horseback Archery comite French Equestrian Federation / National Selectioneer FFE Horseback Archery, and acknowledged receipt thereof. Alan is having a meeting with the federation tomorrow so he may have news thereafter. Suggestion from Deirdre: To standardize using Gauchaux every year (a test match can be arranged while we're there) we can then use this competition every year for earning our colours every year. Riders will know in advance to prepare or save for France and we don't have to then scramble every year to try find a country or competition where we'll be allowed to earn our colours. Suggestion from Diane: To suggest to France an alternating structure. To put a standard agreement in place with France. One year SA goes to France at Gauchoux and next year France comes to SA for a test match. This is a great suggestion; council agreed this would be the best option. 		 Records can only be obtained if it was achieved at a "MAASA Record Status Event". The following constitutes a MAASA Record Status Event: All official MAASA Qualifiers, Provincials and Nationals with an official MAASA judge as head judge. IHAA wGP (World Grand Prix) competitions with an official MAASA judge as head judge. Records set at SANESA qualifiers will only be awarded if the optional MAASA grading has been requested when entering through the SANESA system thus enabling the rider to use the scores towards a MAASA grading. Unless run together as a MAASA qualifier, IHAA postal match scores cannot be used. If an applicant believes that they have set a new South African Record they must email the National Secretary with their scoresheet and request. National Records will be announced on Facebook as well as the MAASA Newsletter and MAASA Website. Council approves of motion: Maretha accepts, Diane seconds.

	for, motivated and approved by Council.
	Do we need to put Novice riders in a category on their own, with a reduced membership
	fee?
	The amounts for each category can perhaps be rounded off for ease of reference e.g. R472
	could be R475
	• The 5% annual increase – will that be sufficient to cover our fixed expenses for
	2023?
	 Can we afford to give a discounted rate to two or more members of a family next
	year? We did that to help everyone during the worst of the pandemic, in order to
	keep membership numbers level, not sure if we still need to make that allowance
	again?
	 Our projected income from membership fees for 2022 was R24 000.00. What was the actual emount that we callested for memberships? Less Patro has projected
	the actual amount that we collected for memberships? I see Petro has projected
	R30 000 for next year, I'm concerned we won't reach that amount considering we
	won't have the Okusha members renewing their membership next year.
	Can we consider enforcing a penalty for late renewal of memberships? I think we
	need to give everyone until the end of January to get their memberships up to date,
	but thereafter charge penalties for late renewal.
	 International affiliation fees – SAEF has budgeted for this, they are supposed to
	refund us our IHAA affiliation fees. Helen Thrush is the SAEF Treasurer, we can
	contact her to find out how to get this back.
	We will need a separate budget for the Development grant for our provinces – they
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	Notice of membershin	 will need to apply for and motivate their application, and it will need to be ratified by Council, but the figures will need to be presented at the OGM as a separate budget. Would it be possible to have some idea of projected income/expenses versus actual income/expenses for 2022? I have requested a report from SANESA regarding the grading fees they collected on our behalf during this year; I will let you know how much we can expect to be refunded when I hear from them. Comments from Deirdre: (Rephrase to make more clear what is meant by that option: "SANESA Riders that want to apply for a MAASA grading". For the Development Riders description also add: "Applicant must be of a previously disadvantaged group or show evidence of being in need of financial aid. Free membership for the first year only." (Do we then work out a fee for development riders for their 2nd year onwards or do they pay normal fees from there onwards? Novice riders in a category on their own: Yes I would say so, since they won't have their own dedicated qualifiers (as we tried to implement this year) and will need to do their gradings at training shows only). Regarding family discounts I'm in favour of keeping it that way for families (only if both family members ride) Penalty for late renewal of memberships: We tried enforcing the penalty fee this year, but people that paid late didn't bother to pay the extra RI50 for the penalty fee, we then made exceptions for some of the people that did enter late and because this wasn't fair to other riders we just scrapped the penalty fee. If we are going to implement it then we need to enforce it for all or not implement it at all. Development grant for provinces: is this a once of grant or something they can apply for annually?
