

Horse Safety Track Assessment

Any new horse has to be graded by a MAASA judge as "On Track" or "Off Track", based on the safety level and control that can be displayed when a rider is shooting bow & arrow from its back with NO reign contact. Should a rider wish to compete at a trot then this level of control should be shown in a trot etc. The horse is not allowed to break pace.

Horses will be graded as "On Track" or "Off Track" before they are allowed to participate in any MAASA organised event. All horses must be adequately trained and experienced in mounted archery and must be fit enough to complete all their required runs at canter or gallop.
